

Yaesu System Fusion Net Saturdays – 7:00 pm.

6:59pm Analog mode and then digital mode:

“We will be starting the Saturday night Yaesu System Fusion net in about one minute. This net uses Yaesu's Fusion digital technology. During the net, if you are using an analog-only radio and would like to avoid hearing the digital noise signal please set your receive PL tone to 127.3. This will eliminate the digital noise you hear during the net. If anyone needs to use the repeater prior to the start of the net, please do so now. This is (call sign), net control.”

7:00pm “Digital narrow” mode:

Good Evening! This is (call Sign), my name is (Name) in (Location). I will be your net control this evening and all communications for this net should come at the direction of this net control station. Please lock into the DN mode for this net.

On behalf of Milwaukee Radio Amateurs' Club, which sponsors this, the W9RH, 145.390 repeater, I would like to welcome you to the Saturday Night Yaesu System Fusion Net. Everyone is invited to listen, and licensed Amateur Radio Operators, Technician Class or higher, are encouraged to check in to this net.

When checking into this net please say “this is” and un-key your mic and if the frequency is clear continue with your call sign in standard phonetics. Once again, this is (call sign), (name) in (location).

We will now take check-ins in the segment of:

A – Alpha through M – Mike. Come now please.

N – November through Z – Zulu. Come now please.

At end of first round: “At this time, we'll take any late check-ins for the Saturday night Yaesu System Fusion net. Please come now to net control.”

End of Net:

“At this time we would like to thank the Board and Members of the MRAC for the use of this repeater and all their support. I will now secure this net at ____ (Local Time).”
