Some items of note since our last newsletter:

- there was a typo in Nov newsletter, CD #1 has \$5,178 as shown above, not \$5,187.

- We have discontinued the paper statements from our bank, saving the club \$10/month.

- Our insurance policy has been renewed at the same cost as last year, \$200, this covers our club events and equipment. That cost came in after the January Treasurer's report closed, so it will be on our February report.

- A mailing was sent out at the end of 2021 to members who had not renewed yet. \$26 for mailing postage and to have stamps on hand. This resulted in a number of renewals.

PURPOSE: to promote FM simplex operation and VHF/UHF contesting while giving new hams an opportunity to develop their contesting skills.

TIMING: 2m (1:00 pm - 2:00 pm), 70cm (2:00 pm - 2:30 pm), 6m (2:30 pm - 3:00 pm), 1.25m (3:00 pm - 3:30 pm), Digital Voice* (3:30 pm - 4:00 pm)

FREQUENCIES: simplex only, no repeaters or satellites. Please view the rules for specific simplex frequencies prior to operation.

AWARDS: Certificates for each 1st place per category, per band. Limit one award per person. Winning club is recognized on the plaque at HRO Milwaukee.






Please make sure you bring your own pencils, pens, and calculator if needed (please clear memories prior to the exam session). Cell phones may not be used as a calculator. If you are testing to upgrade your amateur radio license, please bring a copy of your current license. All candidates are required to wear a mask while inside the facility.
